Population Drives Labor Force

- In the past decade the overall population declined 3%
 - Labor force declined -2.1% over the same period
 - Second slowest population growth (decline) in the state
- Some solid growth in youngest cohort (<5 years, +6.8% from 2000-2019)
- Trends being driven by decline in Whites, estimated 11,600 fewer White residents in 2019 than in 2000. Roughly half o the losses are offset by gains in minority population.
- Population Projected to decline another 4.9% from 2020- to- 2040.


Projected Labor Force

- Because the labor force is a subset of the population, the decline is projected to be more dramatic.
- Jury is still out on how COVID19 will shift retirements.
- Seems unlikely more people will delay retirement
- Will the LFPR decline for the oldest workers and erase gains over the past few decades?

Figure 21. Percentage of Workforce by Age Group, Total of All Industries, 2009-2019






It's Like **Déjà vu all over again**



Job Vacancy Details

- Even for full-time openings 46% require less than 1 year of experience
- 84% of FT openings offer healthcare, but the lowest share is found in farming occupation (43%) and healthcare support (61%)
 - Only 31% of PT opening offer healthcare
- 25% of all openings are offering more than \$21.82
 - \$24.02 for FT and \$16.98 for PT

2019- to- 2020 4th Quarter Change in Vacancies in Southwest Minnesota







Figure 11. Mean Travel Time to Work in Minutes, 2019 0.0 10.0 20.0 30.0 Region 8 18.5 min. Minnesota Source: 2015-2019 ACS







- 38% of jobs are at employers with 100 or more jobs






