THE TRAIL -

1967

The Casey Jones State Trail became the first designed state trail in Minnesota.

SINCE THEN...

- 600+ Miles of paved trail have been built in Minnesota
 - **14** Of those miles are located in Southwest Minnesota



-THE VISION-

100+ Miles

The trail will connect from Luverne to Redwood Falls, stretching across 4 counties.

BUILDING MOMENTUM

- **#10** In 2017, Lake Shetek State Park was the tenth most visited tourist attraction in Southern MN
- **36%** Membership to the Friends of the Casey Jones State Trail has increased by 36% in the last year
 - **12** Communities/organizations have submitted letters of support
- **\$840** Has been secured through LCCMR 2021 funding to rehabilitate the north segment of the Currie Loop
- \$700 Has been secured through 2021 Legacy funding to complete paving of the final 2 miles to the City of Woodstock

With other trails expanding in the region, there is potential for a vast, interconnected series of trails crisscrossing Southwest Minnesota.
