Project Description:

The City of Fulda is in the process of performing an environmental review pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act for the USDA, Rural Utilities Service so that they may assess the environmental impacts of constructing improvements to their municipal wastewater collection and treatment facility, and their water supply and treatment facility both in Murray County. The proposed project is intended to bring the city's municipal sewage discharge into compliance with federal and state requirements.

Staff Comments:

- The city constructed their stabilization pond in 1964. The pond has become hydraulically overloaded due to high levels of infiltration and inflow in the collection system from various sources, including sanitary services, direct connection from roof drains, sump pumps or foundation tile, and manholes.
- The one lift station for the City was constructed in 1964 and rehabilitated in 1998. The pumps and fixtures have reached their design life and are in need of replacement. Overall, the collection system is approximately 70-80 years-old.
- The City's raw water supply comes from five wells and their water treatment plant was constructed in 1990 and rehabilitated in 2013. The plant is designed to remove iron and manganese with the uses of gravity filters, a clear well, and an elevated water storage tank. Waste from backwashing the filters is sent directly to the sanitary sewer collection system. As of now the water treatment facility and tower are in good condition, needing only minor valve replacement.
- With operation and maintenance costs factored, in the City's best solution is to rehabilitate their existing waste water treatment facility, reduce Infiltration/Inflow through a combination of main replacement, main lining and spot repairs and replacement of aging watermain in the distribution system.
- Staff contacted the county engineer and they are in support of this project and the needs that it addresses. It was noted, however, that the county roads in the city will need restoration as part of the project.

• Lincoln County Zoning — Lincoln County met with SRDC staff January 27 to review changes made thus far and gave direction on efforts going forward.

Waste Management / Energy / Natural Resources

Waste Management:

• The Solid Waste commission met on January 27. The commission expressed interest in the possibility of conducting a feasibility study of a waste to energy facility.

Energy:

RMEB—Met on January 27. Election of officers resulted in Gene Metz as Chair, Tom Appel as Vice-Chair, Mic VanDeVere as Secretary, and Dan Wildermuth as Treasurer. The board approved up to \$6,000 in 2020 for SRDC to do PACE outreach activities. For the summer tour, staff will assist in organizing a visit for both RMEB and the Solid Waste Commission to the Wilmarth Generating Facility in Mankato on June 1. The major legislative issues are the new Clean Energy First Initiative and energy transmission capacity. Kevin Friesen from USDA Rural Development presented on the Rural Energy for America Program (REAP).

Communications Report—February 2020

Local Communication Assistance—Staff sent a communications/marketing proposal to the Windom Area Chamber of Commerce to assist with their social media/marketing needs. Development Planner Jason Walker and Communications Specialist Jessica Welu are scheduled to present a marketing and outreach proposal to the Friends of the Casey Jones Trail Association on February 6th. Initial conversations have also started for assisting an RLF business with website development.

Staff is available to assist with local communication/marketing planning, ADA document compliance, document design, branding, etc.

MADO Quarterly Communications and Marketing Meeting—The first MADO Communications and Marketing staff meeting was held January 30 in Willmar. Communications staff were present from SRDC, RNDC, R5DC, WCI, UMVRDC, HRDC, and NWRDC (front cover picture: MADO Communications Staff). Topics discussed were communication strategies, workplans, creating greater engagement, ADA compliance, use of video marketing, and MADO website planning. MADO Communications staff are currently working on a proposal for a MADO Communications Plan and ADA Accessibility Plan, with anticipated presentation at the next Executive Directors meeting. The next Communications meeting is scheduled for April 30 in Alexandria.

Minnesota Network Learning Community—Development Planner Jason Walker and Communications Specialist Jessica Welu attended the second training January 14-15. The final training session is scheduled for March 10-11 in St. Cloud.

Communications Plan— Staff submitted the draft communications plan to TCU faculty at the end of December. Staff attended the winter Certified Public Communicator training January 10-11 in Fort Worth, TX (Report follows) where we received feedback on our draft plans. Planning work on the goal and strategies continues through March. The next focus area will be SRDC's role in regional crisis communication. Final Communication Plan drafts will be due to TCU in June. Summer training/graduation is scheduled for July 19-24.

Communications Specialist's Report February 3, 2020

Friday, January 10th Highlights

Measurement for Your Plan & Why It Matters

Session Presenter: Dr. Julie O'Neil, Associate Dean of Strategic Communication at TCU

This session explored measurement and evaluation tools, their uses, and how to use these tools to find insight to improve performance. Levels of measurement and evaluation were discussed: 1. Basic, Production Measurement; 2. Measurement for Message Retention; and Measurement for Behavioral Changes. O'Neil stressed the importance of level 3 measurements as they can provide the most insight and stressed the need to move beyond level 1 measurements, to consider our end objectives and the call to action for our strategies and objectives.

Keywords, Google, Link-Building, and SEO

Session Presenter: Michael Magnus, Advertising and Creative Strategy Professor at TCU and University of Texas—Arlington

This session focused on Search Engine Optimization (SEO), which, simply, is how people research and are able to find an organization online. The session discussed SEO statistics and why SEO is important. According to research, 89% of customers begin their buying/research process with a search engine. While less than 10% of people click on paid search advertisements, search ranking is critical.

The session discussed content, backlinks, and security as the three most important pieces of SEO. Magnus provided software and tool suggestions for researching SEO analytics specific to our organizations. The rest of the session we explored strategies for developing keyword-enriched content and link building, and how these two pieces affect SEO.

<u>Insights from CPC Homework: Charting Your Organization's Communication, Communication Audit, and Developing a Social Media Plan</u>

Session Presenter: Jacque Lambiase, Strategic Communication Department Chair at TCU

This fall we were asked to complete assignments each month. These assignments were turned in to TCU as development steps for our communication plans.

- In September we were asked to chart the flow of communication to and from our organization and answer questions about how many voices are heard, who oversees message content, what channels are used to communicate and to listen, who is our audience, what policies govern our interaction, and how do we characterize our side of community discussions.
- In October we were asked to audit our organization's communications. This included auditing our digital communication and traditional communication coming from our organization. We were then asked to complete a SWOT analysis and address what needs to change in the next 1-3 years to improve our strategic communication efforts.
- In November we were asked to write a social media policy for our organization. This policy will be included in the appendix of our plans.
- In December we were asked to turn in a draft of our communication plan.

The session reviewed these assignments, highlighted portions of work completed by the cohort, and provided a discussion on the insights we found and how to use these insights to strengthen our plans. The session then went on to discuss our plan drafts in detail. Some key questions asked were: what happens when you replace the word "audience" with "partner"? What happens when we view people as communication channels, not just "audiences"? What measurements most matter to us? How do our communication tasks change when we add demographic information for our internal and stakeholder audiences? Three important factors were also stressed: 1. We need to make clear connections between our communication goals and the organization's strategic initiatives, 2. We need to address crisis communication for our organizations (and in SRDC's case, this might also include for our region), 3. For those of us with 1-person departments, we need to address who our backup is and have a plan to train that backup on key communication tasks so that communication efforts are not lost in the event that we are not available.

Saturday, January 11th Highlights

Change Management: Changing the Way We Communicate Change


Session Presenter: Sarah Greer Osborne, Director of Communications and Media Relations, League City, TX

This session stressed that while communications is not the same as change management, for change management to really work, communication is essential and communications must be involved from the very beginning. Change management tools were then explored, including the 5Ps: Project, Purpose, Particulars, People and Payoffs; and ADKAR: Awareness, Desire, Knowledge, Ability, and Reinforcement. The session explored, in detail, the ADKAR tool, and addressed factors that influence change from each of the five areas.

The Science of Community Input

Session Presenter: Kevin Lyons, co-founder of FlashVote and CEO Governance Sciences Group

This session discussed the issues of government communication: Who do we listen to? How do we assure the community input we receive is an accurate view of the community we serve? We explored core communication purposes, how government communication channels have changed, why we need community input, and FlashVote results for citizens' perspectives on government, government communication and community input. Lyons discussed that usually existing public input is misleading. Challenges to community input were discussed. It can be from the same people, it can be we only hear the noise—



and the noisy are not representative of the many, it can be that community perception is flawed. Getting valid, representative community input is, however, essential. Lyons stated that to get a valid sample, the data must be statistically meaningful (between 250-600 responses), the response samples should not be self-selected or biased, and the input requested should be well structured and valid (unbiased questions with context). The rest of the session explored what community input could be helpful and ways to get better represented community input.

Small Group Plan Work and One-on-One Meetings with Our Faculty Advisors

We had time to work in small groups on communication plans and also had the opportunity to work one-on-one with our faculty advisors. My faculty advisor is Dr. Sarah Maben, Communications Professor at Tarleton State University, TX. I worked with Maben on measurement tactics of the communication goals and developed an outline for the establishment of SRDC as a partner in regional crisis communication. I will be working with Maben remotely through June on further development of our communication plan.

Preparation for Summer 2 Session

Prior to wrap-up, we gathered to discuss spring assignments, timelines for the rest of the communication plan process, including getting approval from our organization for the final plan implementation. At this time, the SRDC plan is set for implementation at the beginning of FY2021. The final plan will be due to TCU in June. Approval of the plan by TCU will happen during summer 2 session July 19-24, 2020.

Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) Report—February 2020

A. FUNDS AVAILABLE

Funds are currently available in the approximate amount of \$210,000 (includes a \$20,000 Lyon County loan closed in January). The RLF loan committee has approved another \$25,000 loan to a Nobles County business, but that has yet to close.

B. RECENT ACTIVITY

RLF Committee—The committee meets as needed. The committee last met on January 6.

Servicing Issues—On-going loan servicing issues continue to be addressed. There is one business in Redwood County of particular concern.

New Applicants—Interest rates are as low as 4%. The SRDC RLF Application (fillable) and Requirements Checklist is updated online and can be found at http://www.swrdc.org/economic-development/revolving-loan-funds/.

Southwest Human Resource Association—We are now a member of this association to further assist our RLF clients with issues that arise. They meet quarterly in Marshall with future dates as follows: April 23, July 23 and October 22.

Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE)

Revolving Loan Fund Report — February 2020

A. FUNDS AVAILABLE

Funds are currently available in the approximate amount of \$119,700 (PACE ARRA Funds) and \$326,400 (PACE SEP Funds). SRDC Communications Specialist has assisted with outreach materials and promotion. There has been effort to get our ½ page flyers out to potentially interested businesses or agribusinesses. Staff focused on PACE in January on the KDOM Kaleidoscope.

26 loans have been approved thus far totaling \$957,212.06.

B. PACE COMMITTEE

The committee meets as needed or in conjunction with the RMEB. The committee last met January 27. Committee members are Metz, Wildermuth, Wachal, VanDeVere and Purvis. The next PACE committee will meet March 23 at Pizza Ranch in Slayton.

C. GENERAL INFORMATION

PACE is available to small businesses, including agri-businesses.

If you have groups in your area that would benefit from hearing about PACE, please contact Robin. In-person outreach is now a possibility again thanks to RMEB for allowing up to \$6,000 on concentrated PACE outreach efforts in 2020.

Staff is working with ReTAP and CERTs on a better way to track referrals for free energy assessments. PACE can be the financing source for improvements identified within the energy assessment.

A connection was made to the SMSU Marketing department. The PACE committee will consider their proposal in March.

Transportation Report—February 2020

SRDC Transportation Committee— Nothing scheduled at this time.

Area Transportation Partnerships:

<u>ATP 7</u> — Staff met with MnDOT District planner staff on January 14th in Mankato to discuss TAC duties, upcoming TA project scoring, and the SRDC workplan.

There was one project submitted for regional significance scoring for the upcoming ATIP. The project is the reconstruction of CSAH 29 in Jackson County with wider lanes and shoulders and redesigned with less steep slopes. The final score was turned in to MnDOT district 7 on February 11th.

Project selection for Transportation Alternatives funding is to take plan on February 21st. There were no applications from our region for district 7.

<u>ATP 8</u> — District 8 MnDOT Staff initiated a meeting between RDC and MnDOT planner staff within District 8 on January 10th in Granite Falls. Topics discussed were TAC meetings (their purpose, content, membership), TA applications, Bike Plan implementation, and the potential for RDC's to host bike/pedestrian counters.

Applications for Transportation Alternative funding were due January 3rd and project scoring for District 8 is slated to take place on February 21st.

Quarterly Transportation Planners meeting— Scheduled for February 11th through the 12th in Shoreview.

Minnesota's Transportation Conference— Staff will be attending the annual statewide transportation planners conference in St. Paul from March 3rd to March 4th.

Regional Transportation Coordination Council (RTCC)— Met on February 5th at 10:00 am.

Languages & Interpreter services in Southwestern Minnesota— All the work on the Languages & Interpreter Services in Southwestern Minnesota is complete.

Transportation Committee—Scheduled to meet March 31st at 1:00pm in the SRDC Board room. Items on the agenda include Corridor Coalition updates, Proposal for a new regional significance scoring process, a presentation on the MnDOT District 8 Freight Plan, MnDOT District 7 updates, and review of the draft of the Area Transportation Improvement Program (ATIP) both ATP 7 and 8.

Active Living— Statewide Health Improvement Partnership (SHIP) Community Leadership Teams (CLT)

Staff spoke with SHIP representatives about D8 Bicycle Plans along state highways in the MnDOT 5-10 years out plans about identifying communities and exploring what each city would like to see for bicycle accommodations. The list of communities was as follows:

- Marshall
- Minneota (during Active Living meeting they seemed to only want shared road signage and clear marking/signage/crossing to their existing trail in town.)
- Lake Benton
- Pipestone
- Redwood Falls

Safe Routes to School— Four communities submitted applications for SRTS Planning Grants: Adrian, Jackson, Tyler, and Wabasso.

Two communities submitted applications for SRTS Boost Grants: Tyler and Jackson.

Staff submitted budget estimates to MnDOT for each of the Planning Grant applications to aid in their decision-making process. Grant recipients should be announced in April 2020.
